


DEFINITIONS

Legal Mapping: A process for assessing and capturing important features of laws and polices, and for identifying how they vary across jurisdictions or institutions, and over time.

Policy Surveillance: The systematic collection, analysis, interpretation and dissemination of laws and policies across jurisdictions or institutions, and over time.

Legal Assessment: The systematic collection, analysis, interpretation and dissemination of laws and policies across jurisdictions or institutions at one point in time.

LawAtlas: The central place for creating, sharing and accessing authoritative legal health policy surveillance and related resources.

DEVELOPING CODING QUESTIONS

Steps for developing coding questions:

- 1. Review the law and secondary sources
- 2. Finalize the list of constructs
- 3. Develop the response set
- 4. Convert constructs into questions
- 5. Capture unexpected response through iterative coding

Child:


Are vaccine guidelines set by a government agency or nongovernmental agency? Government agency/Non-government agency/None
