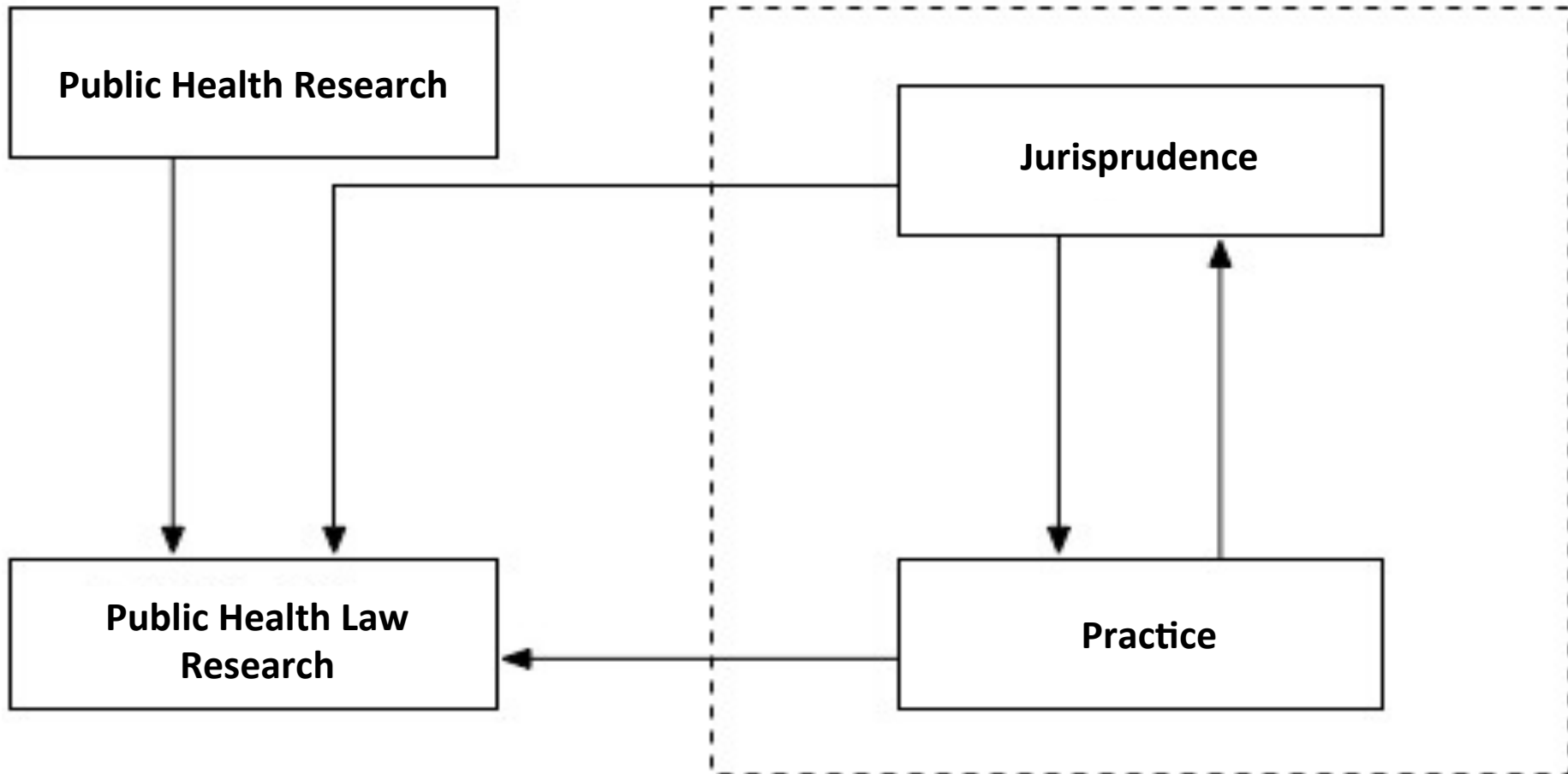

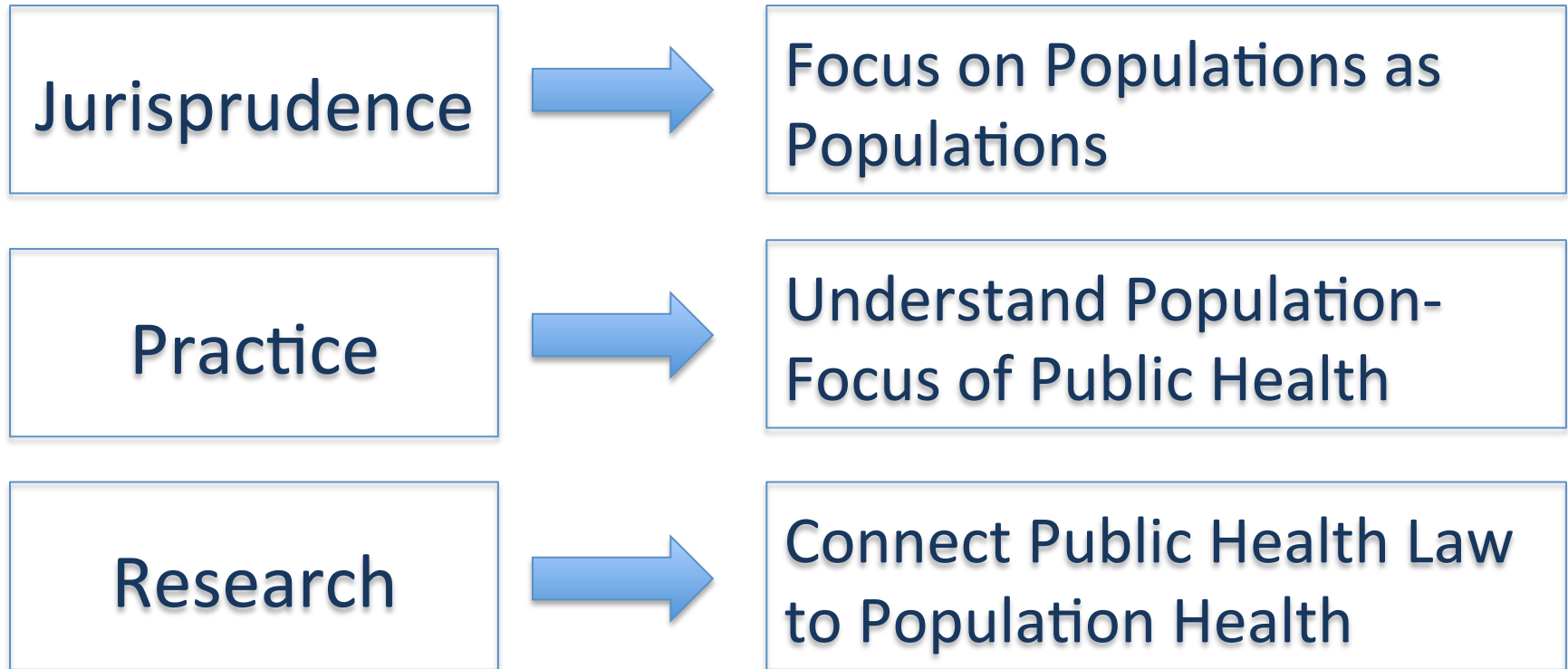

Traditional Model of Public Health Law

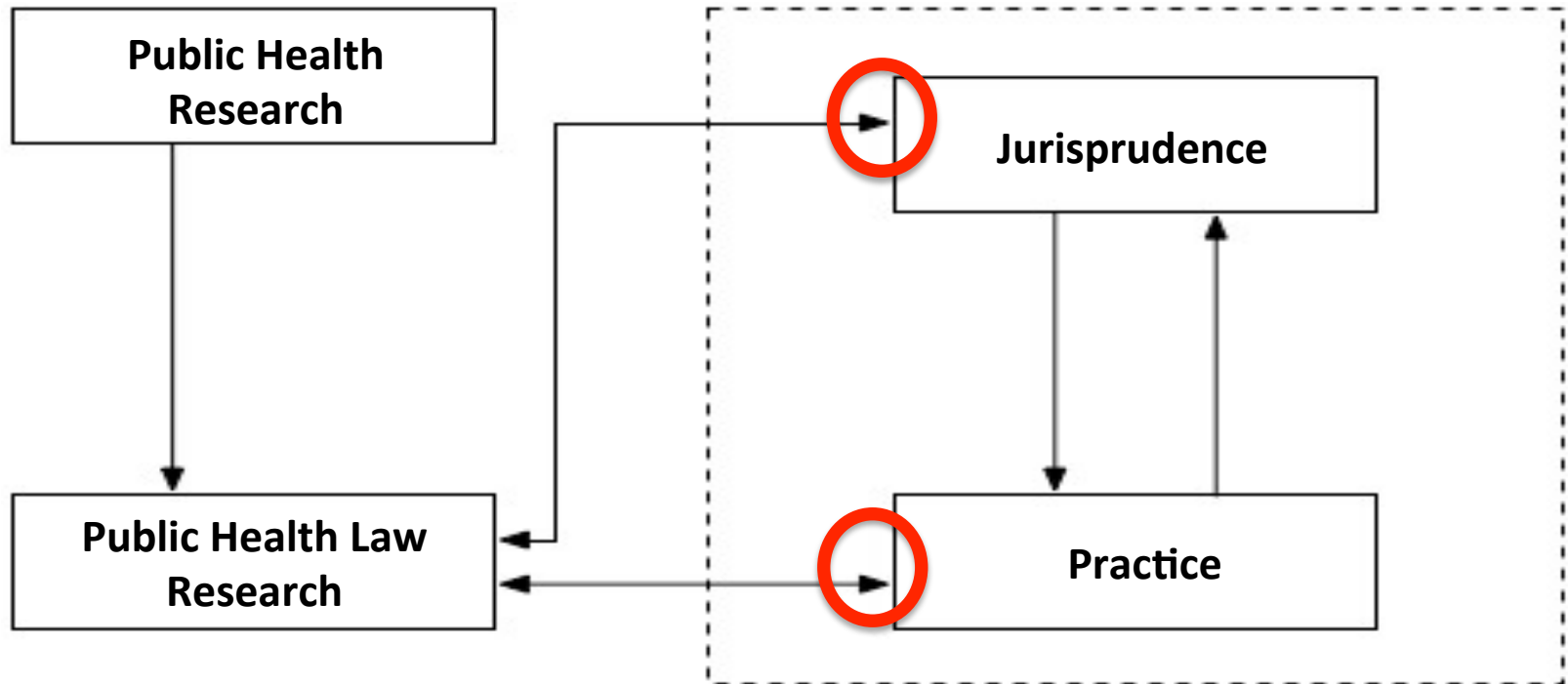
