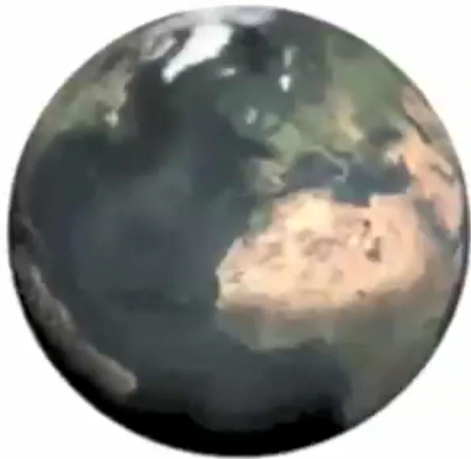

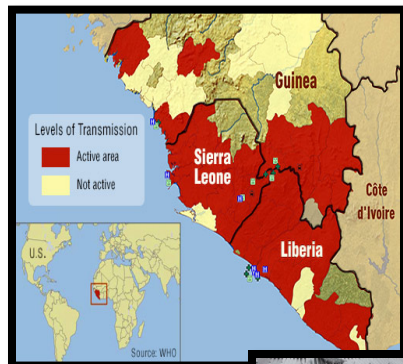

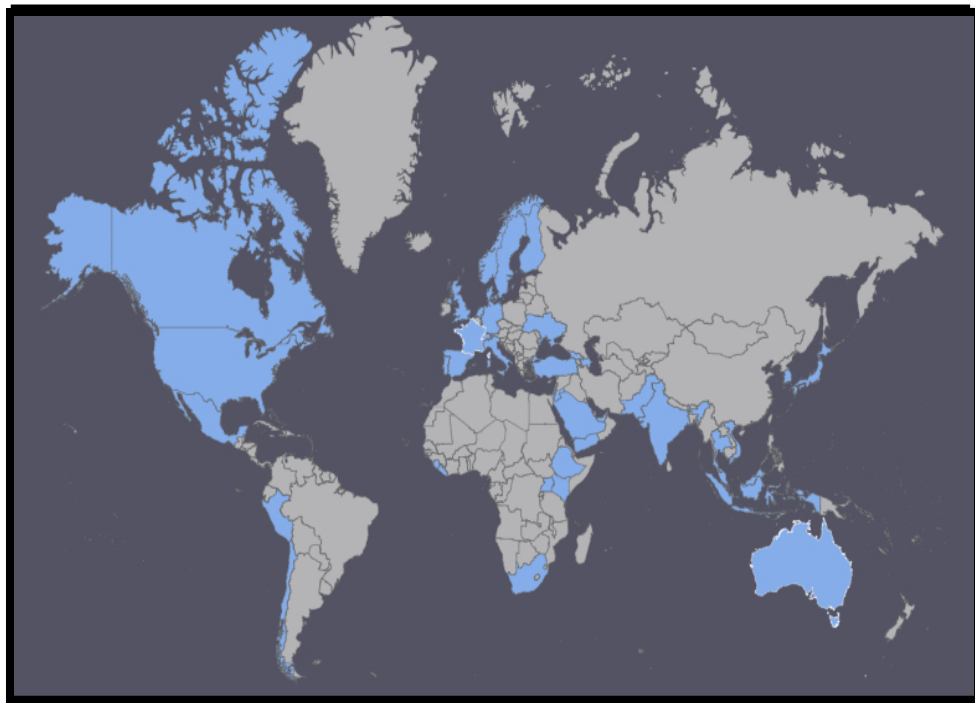

Law as a Determinant of Global Health Security

- Provides clear, *enforceable* regulations, guidelines, and reporting requirements
- Promotes coordination, communication, and information sharing
- Ensures safety and competency standards are met through certification, accreditation, licensing, etc.

Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR)

Law Can:

1. Limit *access* to antibiotics
2. Regulate *professions* contributing to AMR.
3. Manage antibiotic *use*.
4. Enhance *surveillance* and *response*.

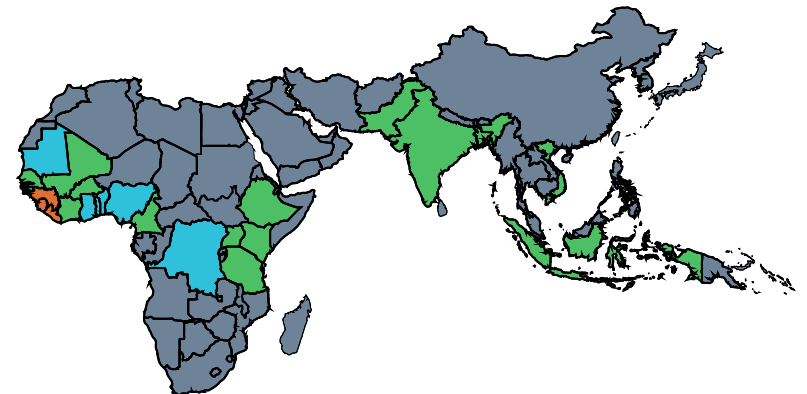

Respond 3 – Medical Countermeasures & Personnel Deployment

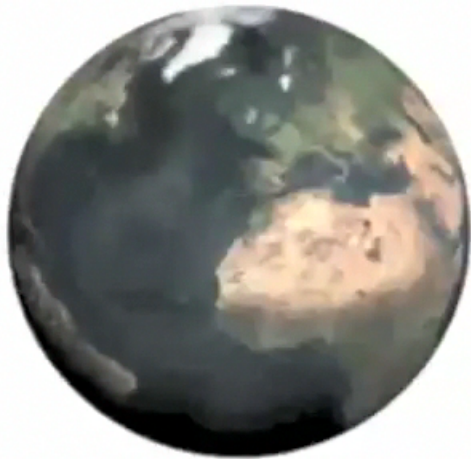
1. Visa Waivers
