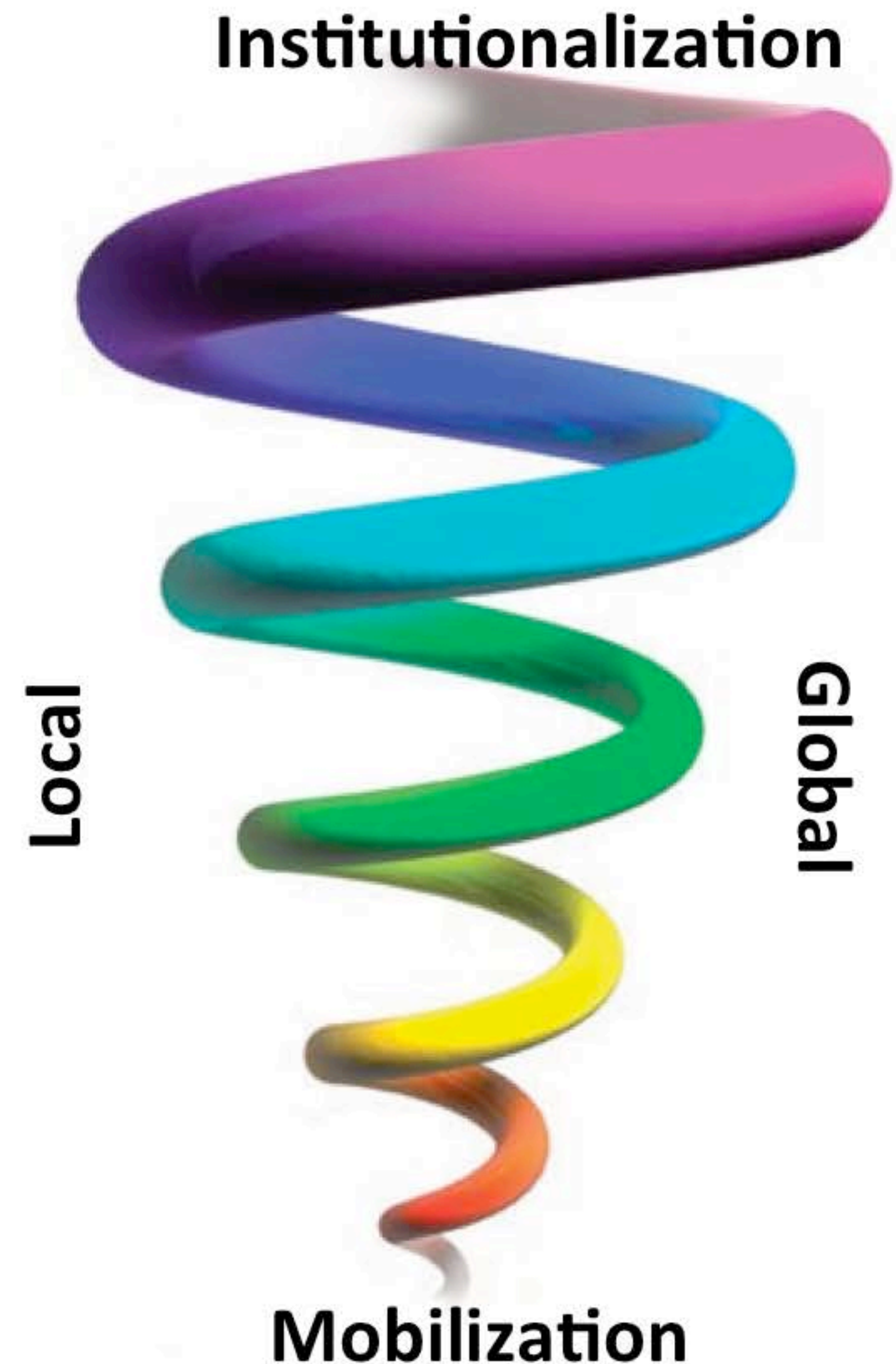

- Reinforce Local Efforts

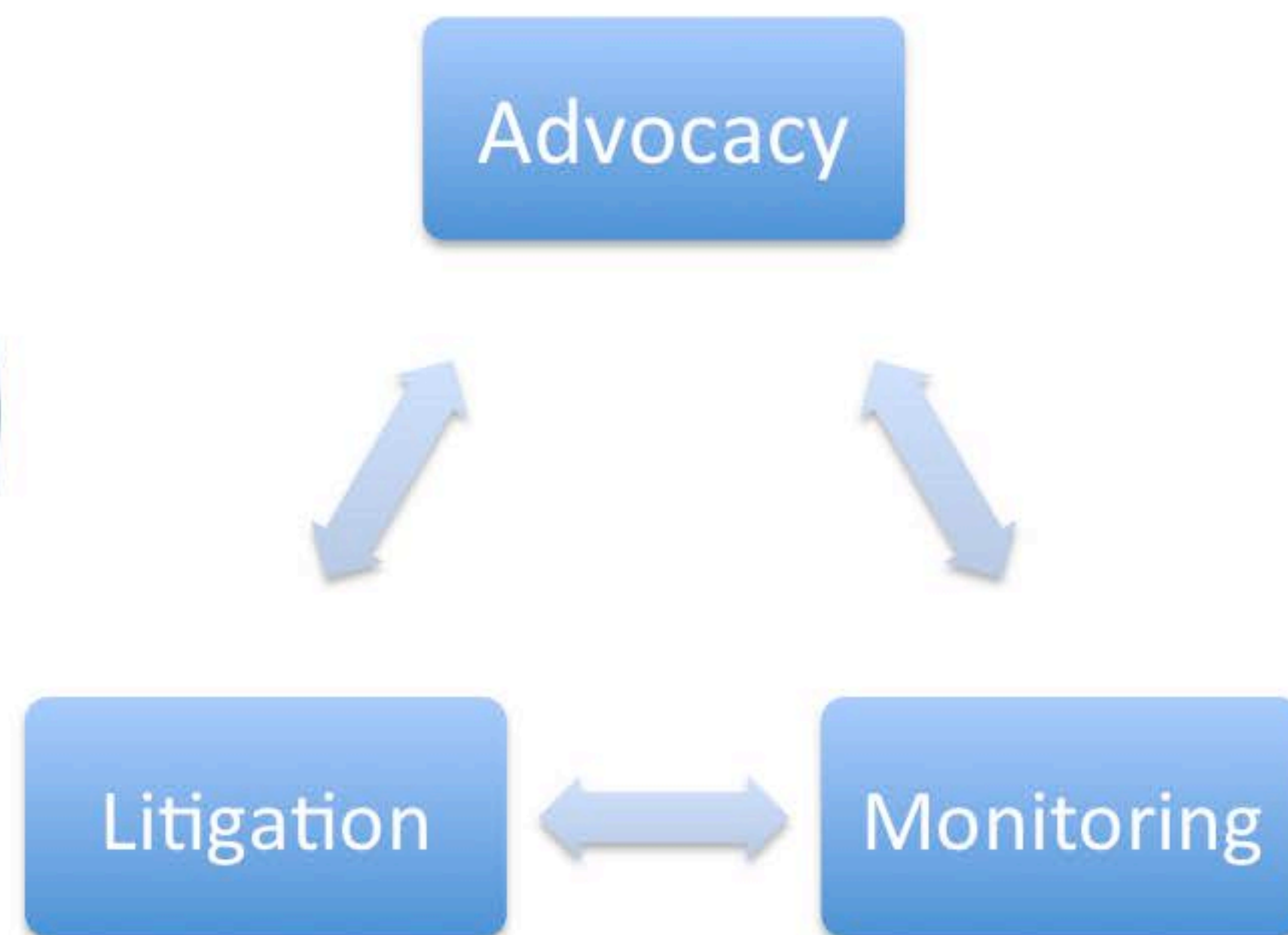
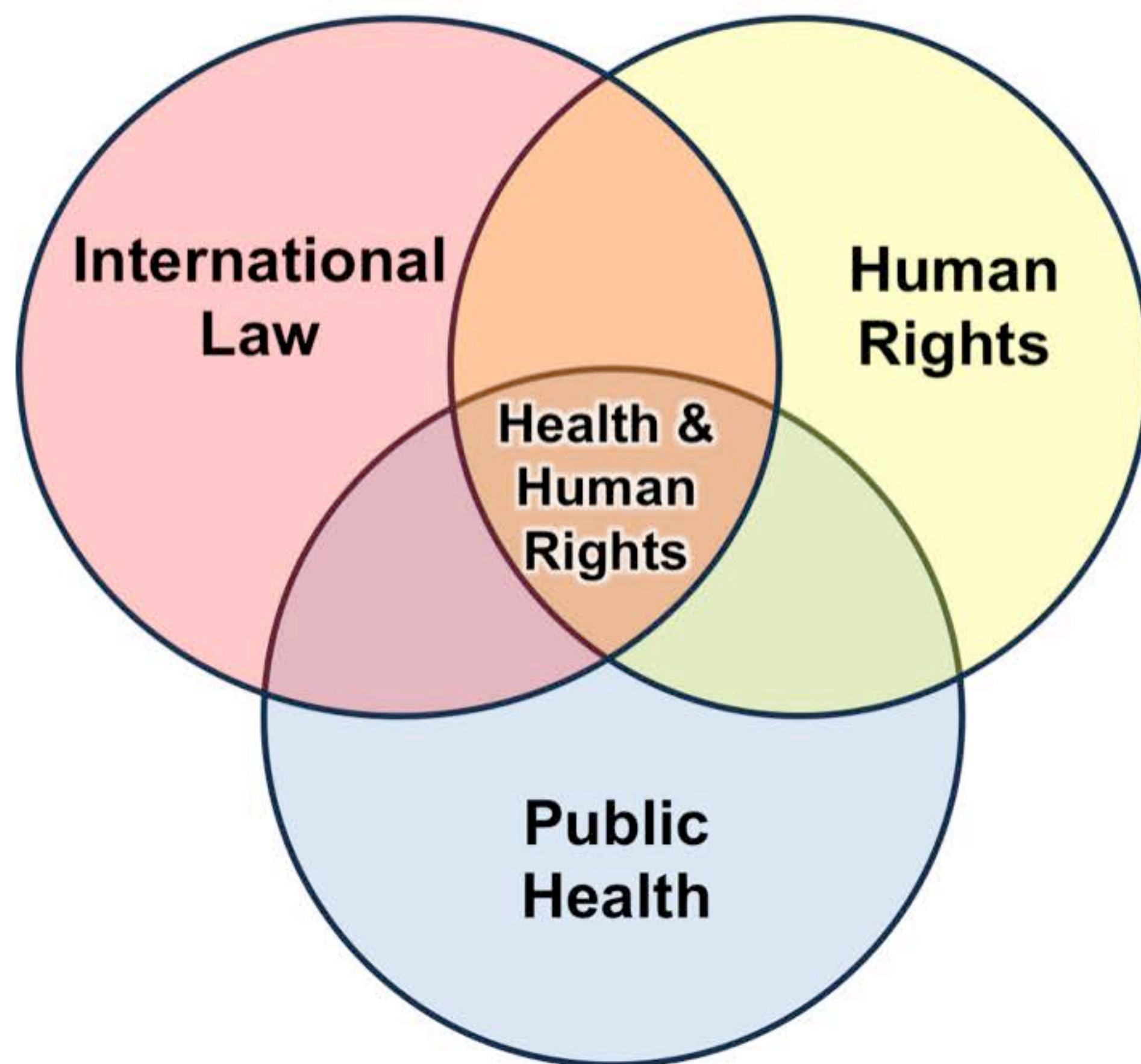

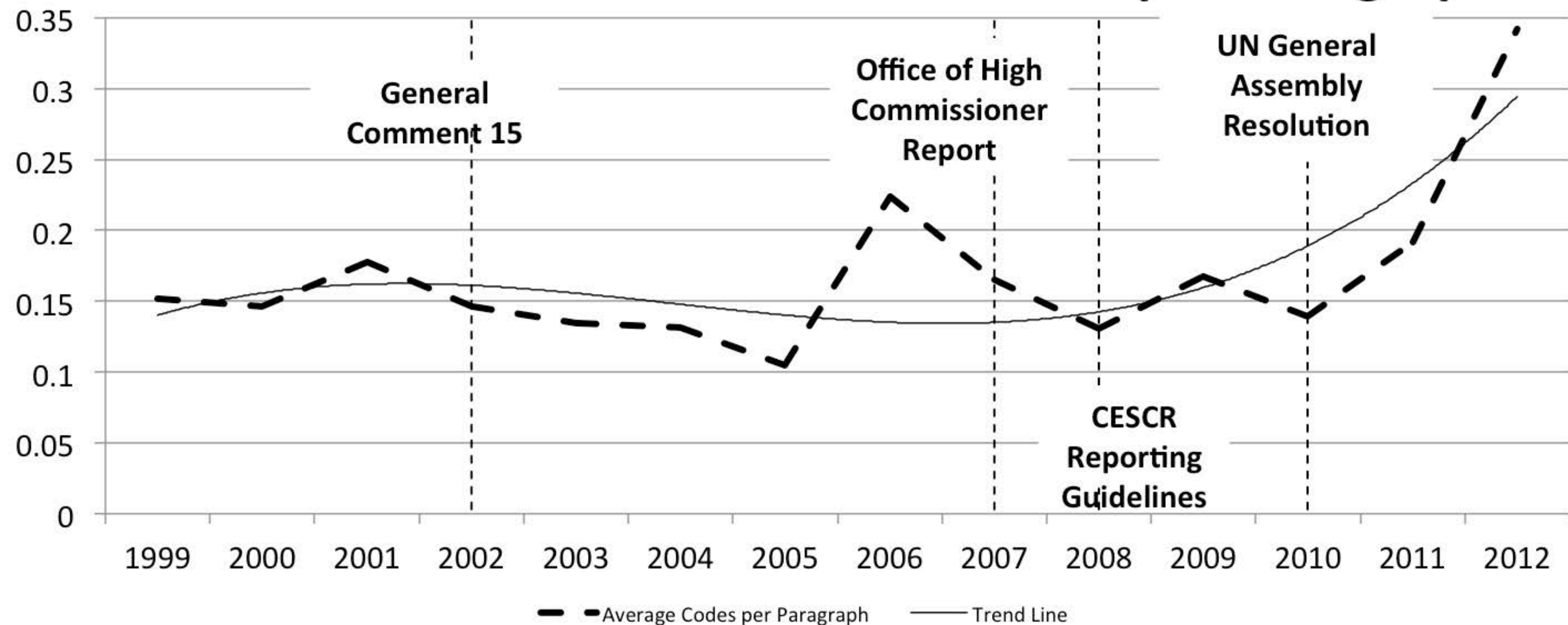

Average Number of Water and Sanitation Codes per Paragraph



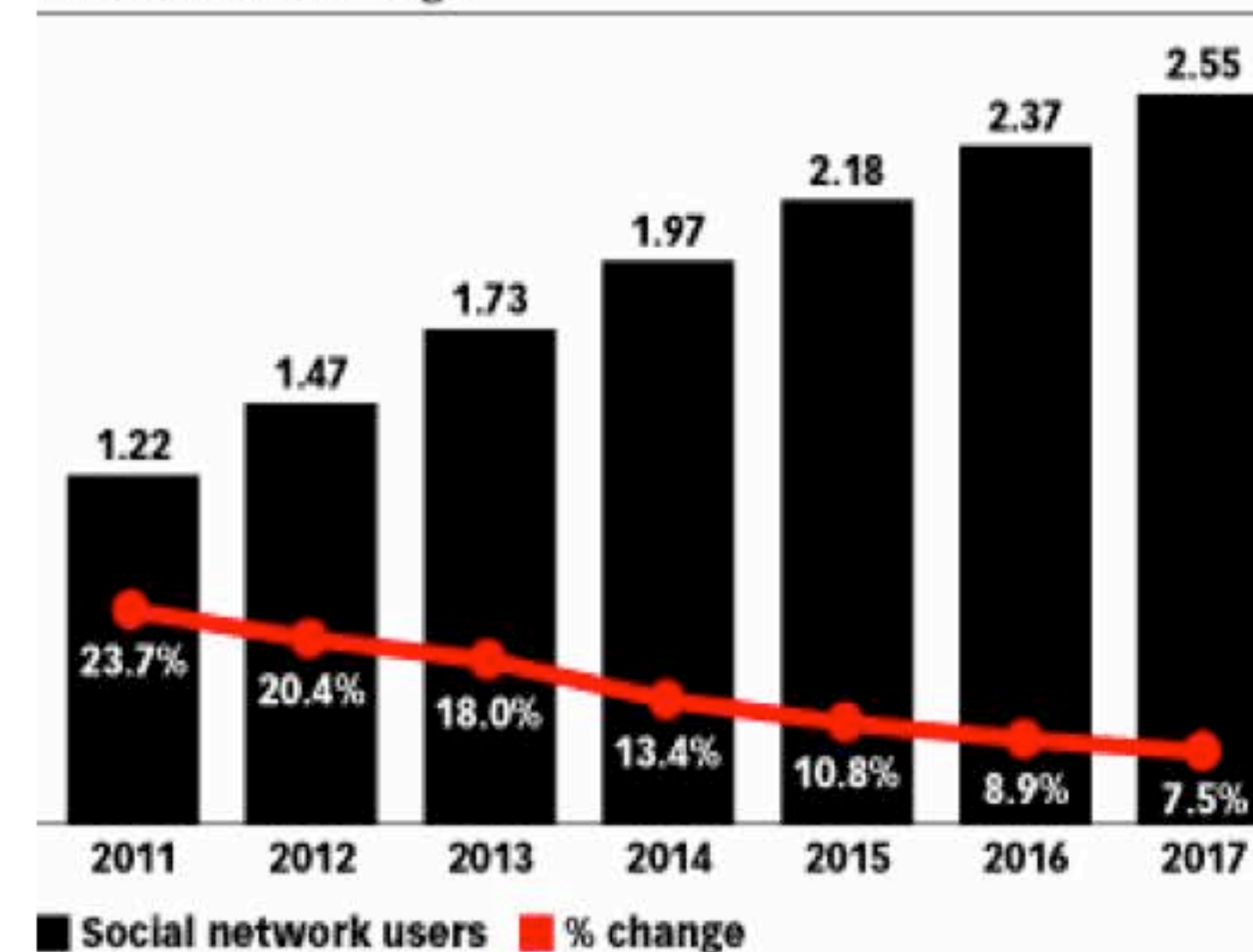

Limitations of Social Media

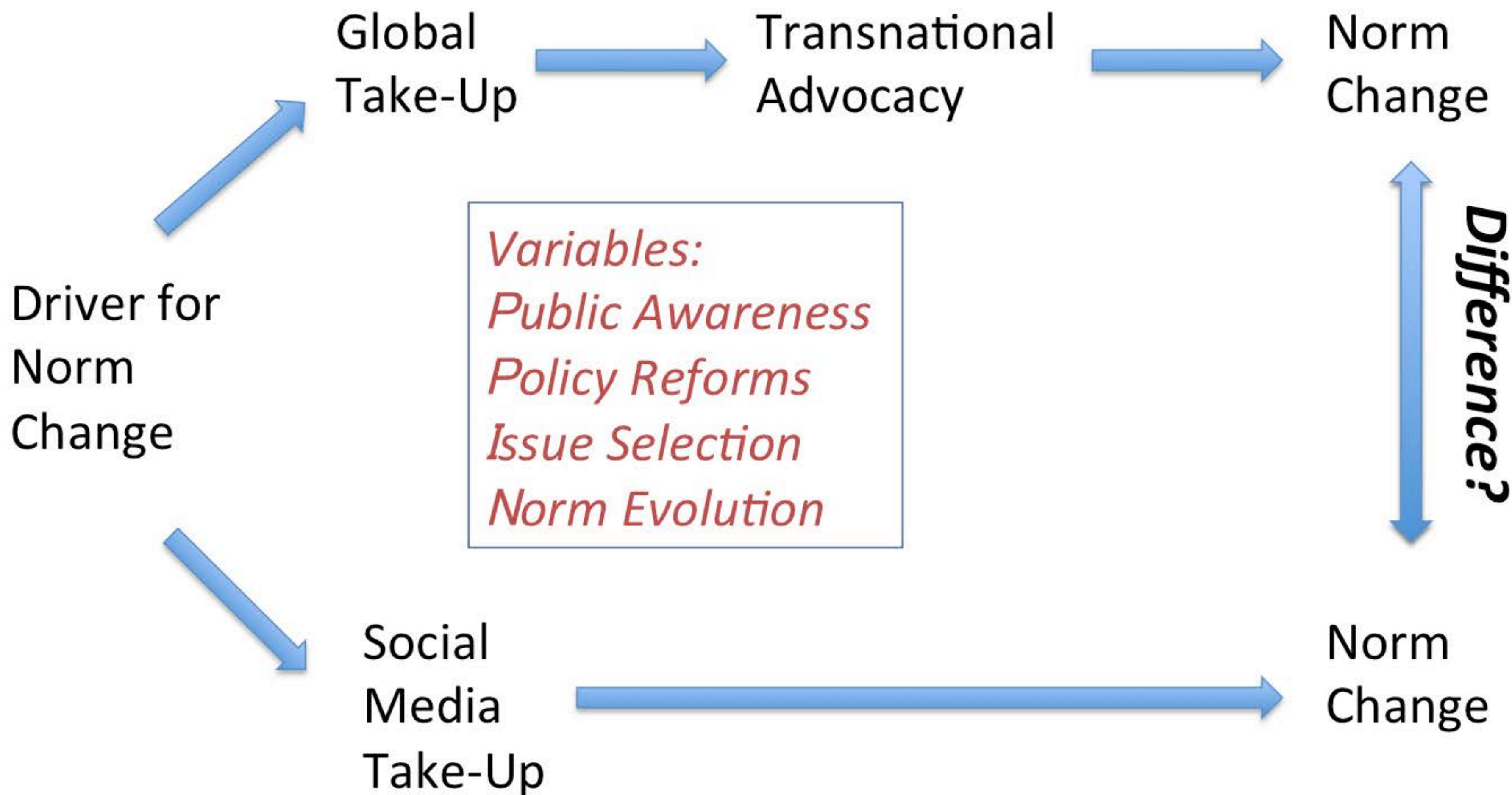
- Issue Selection & Framing
